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Supporting you with the cost of living

Challenges with the cost of living may no longer be the latest news headlines, but Hull City Council remains as committed as ever to supporting residents who may be struggling with their finances.

The council and its partners from the voluntary sector can support residents in a variety of ways from keeping warm, bills and debt, food and benefits to housing, mental health and much more.

And over the winter months they will continue to provide the latest updates about the cost of living.

Community Grants

A funding boost for around 40 voluntary and community organisations across Hull will allow them to help more residents with the cost of living during the colder months.

The Cost of Living Community Grants aim to support households who are finding it difficult to manage financial obligations - such as energy and food - and who may need help with managing debt. Some of the organisations will also use the grants to provide additional Warm Spaces and social activities, helping to bring communities together.

The grants are administered

by the Hull-based umbrella group Forum, with local firm Ideal Heating providing additional sponsorship.

Leader of Hull City Council, Councillor Mike Ross, said: “I’m pleased that so many of these vital groups have been successful in applying for funding to boost their important work.

“They have a great understanding of how this funding can be best spent, whether it’s by providing Warm Spaces, supplying winter clothing and bedding, or visiting people in their homes who can’t get out easily.

“Our Community Plan sets out our aim for a healthier and fairer Hull, and it’s good that these grants will be spread out across the city, both in terms of locations but also the specific groups of people being targeted for help.”

School uniform grants

Hull City Council has also agreed to provide extra help to families with school uniform costs. £50 grants will support around 1,400



Year 7 pupils in the city.

Leader of Hull City Council, Mike Ross, said: “Having been asked to look at the level of funding for school uniforms by full council, I know it was the right move to increase the amount available for those in need. We know that £50 won’t cover every item of uniform, which is why we’ve called on the government to provide additional support to allow local authorities like Hull to get more help to children from low-income families.”

As with previous years, families who receive free school meals who have children in Year 7 will be allocated the £50 grant which will be paid in vouchers. Working with the city’s secondary schools, the funds should be distributed by the start of October half-term.



Most of the funding to help people with cost of living pressures is funded by the Department for Work and Pensions’ Household Support Fund (HSF), which is used in Hull to help the most vulnerable people and families.

Time to talk money



At the start of November Hull City Council and partners will come together to promote Talk Money Week where local experts will join forces to help and support residents with managing their money. Talk Money Week 2025 runs from the 3-7 November and encourages residents to speak up about their money worries. Leader of Hull City Council, Councillor Mike Ross, said: "Talking about money isn't always easy, but it is really important people know there is help out there. This campaign is about helping people feel more confident, supported and highlighting where they can access help." Throughout the week, the council is collaborating with local partners to highlight free, trusted

support to help you take control of your money. There will be resources shared online to highlight what help and support is available. The week will culminate with 'Talk Money Week – Ask the Experts', a public event, taking place at Princes Quay on 8 November from 11am – 3pm on the third floor. Leader of the Council, Councillor Mike Ross added: "The event is a chance for residents to speak directly to local experts in a friendly, informal setting. Whether it's just a quick question or you need help finding the right support, this is a valuable opportunity to get free, honest advice from people who are here to help. Transformed museum will celebrate women in maritime industry

Hull Maritime Museum is entering a bold new chapter in its history. As the Grade II listed building, a cornerstone of the city's heritage is reimagined as a dynamic, 21st century visitor attraction and educational space.

A standout feature of the new galleries will be a powerful portrait honouring the vital role of women in the maritime industry.

Created by acclaimed Yorkshire artist Ruth Fitton, the portrait features Karolina Jabrzyk, a Humber Marine Pilot 1st Class for Associated British Ports (ABP) Humber. This striking artwork not only celebrates Karolina's achievements but symbolises the broader contributions of women in a traditionally male-dominated field.

The portrait highlights the essential work of women like Karolina and the critical role

Humber Pilots play in ensuring the safe navigation of vessels in and out of the estuary.

Ruth Fitton, a self-taught artist with international acclaim, captured Karolina's likeness through a series of sittings and sketches, culminating in a beautifully detailed oil painting that will take pride of place in the museum's permanent collection.

Councillor Mike Ross, Leader of Hull City Council, said: "This portrait is a powerful tribute to the women shaping the maritime industry today. It reflects Hull's proud maritime heritage while also looking forward, recognising the diverse individuals who continue to drive it forward. We are proud to include this important new addition to the Maritime Museum's collection."

Turning a beautiful building into a 21st century museum

Work to transform the Maritime Museum is now reaching a significant milestone, with fit-out specialists Marcon, renowned for their work in heritage and cultural spaces, leading the next phase of the museum's redevelopment.

Following a detailed planning phase, Marcon is set to bring Hull's maritime stories to life through immersive storytelling, cutting-edge technology and interactive displays.

Each gallery will be uniquely



themed to reflect different aspects of Hull's 800-year maritime history, from its bustling docks and shipping industry to its world-famous whaling collections and intricate scrimshaw art. Visitors can expect state-of-the-art displays, striking graphics and captivating audio-visual elements that will breathe new life into the museum's historic interiors.

Hull Maritime is funded by



Hull City Council and The National Lottery Heritage Fund, thanks to National Lottery players. It encompasses the redevelopment of six historic sites in Hull city centre: the transformation of the Grade II Hull Maritime Museum and the Dock Office Chambers, Queen's Gardens and the creation of a new visitor attraction at the North End Shipyard and the restoration of two historic vessels, the Arctic Corsair and Spurn Lightship.

The portrait will be unveiled when the Hull Maritime Museum reopens next year offering visitors a fresh and inclusive perspective on the city's seafaring legacy. With its blend of heritage and innovation, the museum promises to be a beacon of cultural pride for Hull and a must-visit destination for generations to come.





Getting ready for recycling change

We're introducing new waste management schemes in Hull. With just three clear categories, recycling is simple. Less waste, less hassle - more impact for our community and the environment.

From March 2026, recycling will be easier and more consistent across England. The new Simpler Recycling system means everyone, whether at home, work or school, will be able to recycle the same materials.

Hull already meets many of the

government's new simpler recycling standards. However, some key changes are coming:

- weekly food waste collections will be introduced for all flats and households
- households with brown bins

will have them collected weekly from March 2026

- blue bin collections will continue as normal for all households
- flats will receive new recycling facilities and separate food waste bins
- businesses and public buildings to separate food waste and recyclables from general waste.

Flats recycling trial

Trials are taking place at a number of flats across the city to prepare for the city-wide rollout of recycling and food waste collections. This will see a six-month trial launch for over 700 flats across the city. The trial will test:

- different bin types and collection frequencies
- ways to reduce contamination
- how to keep bin areas clean and tidy.

Our recycling staff have been out engaging with residents throughout the trial to gather feedback and help shape the final service.

Why recycling matters

Recycling is important for both the environment and local services. Unlike black bin waste, which is often incinerated, recycled materials are reused, helping to lower carbon emissions. It also costs less to recycle waste than to process general waste, saving money for council taxpayers and allowing more funding for other essential services.

With the introduction of

weekly food waste recycling, collected food waste will be turned into peat-free compost, supporting local farmers and promoting sustainable agriculture.

Waste and recycling packs

Waste and recycling packs should have arrived on residents' doorsteps from the first week of October. The packs include your new waste and recycling centre pass - keep this until March 2027, as well as information guides and a calendar for the next few months. However, from March 2026, you will receive a new calendar with the new changes.

holder for environment, Hull City Council, adding, "The new waste management scheme will make the recycling process for residents in Hull much simpler. By adding a weekly food waste collection, it will bring down the amount of general waste we are producing. I am pleased as this will also have a huge, positive, impact on the environment."



Free bulky items collection

All Hull City Council households are eligible for one free bulky item collection of up to 5 single items in a 12-month period. If you need to dispose of more, there is a minimum charge of £5.

Tackling fly-tipping in Hull

The council continues to keep Hull clean, clearing tonnes of fly-tipping every month. Recently, enforcement officers referred five fly-tipping cases for prosecution, resulting in the offenders receiving a criminal record, and paying a combined £3,950 in fines and costs.

Councillor Charles Quinn, portfolio holder for environment, said: "Fly-tipping is a crime. It's unsightly and harmful. Together, we can keep Hull clean."

Fly-tipping is defined as the 'illegal deposit of any waste onto land that does not have a licence to accept it'. Anyone caught fly-tipping will receive a £1,000 fine.

If the fine is unpaid, attempts



to communicate are ignored or the council has to remove waste, the case will be referred for prosecution – which can result in an unlimited fine, imprisonment, or both.

Support for families struggling with school attendance



Hull City Council is reaching out to parents and carers across the city with a clear message: you're not alone. The council is encouraging families to access the wide range of support available to help children get back into the classroom.

While attending school every day may seem straight forward, many families face real and complex barriers that make regular attendance difficult.

From mental health struggles to financial pressures, these challenges can quickly lead to a decline in attendance that's hard to reverse.

Councillor Linda Tock, portfolio holder for children's services says: "Helping families overcome the barriers to school attendance is one of the most important things we can do. It's not about blame – it's about working together to give every child the best chance.

"We know every family's situation is different, and we're here to listen, not judge. Our role is to make sure support is available when it's needed most."

Recognising this, Hull City Council is working closely with schools, local services, and

organisations to ensure families receive the right help at the right time. The council's educational welfare team, alongside NHS partners, are committed to offering practical, non-judgmental support tailored to each family's needs.

What support is available?

Depending on individual circumstances, families can access advice on:

- **mental health support for children and parents.**
- **help with school meals, uniforms and independent travel training.**
- **advice on applying for a school place.**
- **guidance from the education welfare team.**

To make support more accessible, the council is hosting informal "Tea and Chat" sessions every term. These drop-in

events take place at Family Hubs and youth centres across Hull, offering expert advice in a relaxed setting where families can talk openly about any issues affecting attendance.

Hull City Council is urging families not to wait until problems become overwhelming. If you're feeling unsure, worried, or overwhelmed about your child's school attendance, help is available now.

New vision for the future

In the summer, Hull City Council officially launched its new plan for children and young people.

The Children and Young People's Plan 2025-2030 outlines how the local authority and its partners will work together to improve the lives and outcomes of Hull's youngest citizens. The plan was co-produced with children, young people and partners, creating a strong, shared vision and understanding of the needs of the children and young people in the city.

Through surveys and with the help of local partners, the council managed to gather the views of over 9,000 young people in the city, providing much insight into

the things that need to be focused on in order to most improve children's lives and experiences.

Councillor Linda Tock, the portfolio holder for Children's Services at Hull City Council, said: "Hull City Council has placed children and young people at the very heart of its Community Plan. We have the ambition to make Hull a child-friendly city and a place where lifelong learning is valued, supporting access to good quality jobs, and ensuring everyone can reach their potential.

"Children from across the city have helped the council to co-produce this refreshed five-year Children and Young People's Plan, setting out how we and our partners will

continue to support children. This means we can live in a city that children and young people feel proud to call home and a city where every young person knows their voice matters.

"It's a shared commitment – one that ensures children and young people are not just spoken about, but heard, included, and empowered. The plan helps shape how services are delivered and ensures we are held accountable for the decisions we make and the futures we influence."

Care to share?

Could you open your home to an adult, offer them the best level of care and support and welcome them as a valued member of your family?

This is exactly what Nigel and Brian do, and they love it!

"It's rewarding, very rewarding. We have a nice family unit now. Michael, who we support, is very much loved and we all have a nice life together," explains Nigel.

The scheme needs people with a big heart, strong family values and room in their home to be able to care for and support an adult in living their life with choice and control, doing the things that they enjoy and with the people that are important to them.

Michael describes how this has changed his life: "It's a better life which I never had. I now go on

holidays, swimming and go to the beach."

You can support people on a long-term basis (for as long as you both need and want) or, for short breaks, such as one weekend, a month or an occasional week to give a main carer a break. This gives you flexibility to provide care and support when you can.

You will receive training to meet the person's care and support needs, and you will have ongoing emotional and financial support throughout. No Shared Lives arrangement will take place unless

everyone is happy to go ahead.

Brian is very happy with the support he and Nigel receive. He said: "Any questions, if there is something we are unsure of, we can just ring the Shared Lives Team and get an answer from one of them. They are great to work with."

Councillor Linda Chambers, portfolio holder for adult social care, said: "The commitment from Shared Lives Carers to the people they support is inspirational. I'd like to thank them for being involved in the scheme and I would very much encourage others to do so."

- stay warm – wear several light layers, keep your home at a steady temperature such as 18°C, and use blankets or hot water bottles if needed

- look after your health – book your free flu jab if you're eligible, keep simple remedies at home, and order prescriptions in advance
- be prepared – keep a stock of food, know where your stopcock is, and have a torch handy in case of power cuts

HUMBERSIDE POLICE TO INCREASE OFFICER NUMBERS FOR NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

In April, the Home Office announced an additional £200m investment for Neighbourhood Policing available to Police Forces in 2025/26, with Humberside receiving just over £3.2m. This will enable the force to recruit 38 new Neighbourhood Policing Officers.

Neighbourhood Policing is vital to the British Policing Model, and I want to make sure it is more accessible to all our communities. Humberside Police proactively shares details of your local neighbourhood team's priorities and surgery sessions online for those that want to keep up to date on work in their community.

As highlighted in the latest independent inspection, Humberside Police already have an effective Neighbourhood Policing model, however we will always welcome initiatives to help us to continue to improve the service provided to our communities.



GRANT FUNDING TO HELP IMPROVE COMMUNITY SAFETY

Round 5 of my Community Safety Fund has committed a further £350,000 of funding towards projects led by the voluntary and community sector organisations, social enterprises or town and parish councils across the region. This takes the overall investment committed to the Community Safety Fund since its launch in 2022 to £1,850,000, supporting over 150 projects that impact on crime and community safety at a local level.

This round focused on the purchase of equipment and / or assets that will support the reduction in crime and improvement in community safety, providing funding of between £500 and £35,000 towards eligible projects.

Successful projects in Round 5 include:

- ▶ CCTV for Lonsdale Community Centre
- ▶ Security fencing in the Thornton Allotments
- ▶ Tigers Trust Arena provided with CCTV
- ▶ CCTV for The Preston Road Women's Centre
- ▶ Security Improvements for the Hull Sisters Building
