## Hull's maritime story set to shine in 2026: A year of celebration and discovery

Having been named as one of the top 25 places in the world to visit in 2026, Hull is preparing for a landmark year as its proud maritime heritage takes centre stage. From restored ships to a transformed Maritime Museum, the city will celebrate its seafaring past like never before, creating an exciting new experience for residents and visitors alike.

Next month marks the start of this extraordinary journey with the opening of the beautifully restored Spurn Lightship, a vessel that has been lovingly brought back to life. Berthed in Hull Marina near Murdoch's Connection, the lightship will once again serve as a beacon of Hull's maritime identity, offering visitors a glimpse into the lives of those who kept ships safe along the Humber estuary,

one of the most treacherous waterways in the world.

Behind the scenes, a dedicated group of volunteers and staff have been working tirelessly to maintain the lightship in its new berth. From swabbing the deck and carrying out essential maintenance, their all-important efforts ensure the vessel's longevity on the water and preserve this vital piece of Hull's maritime story.

On behalf of the volunteers, Alan Balcam, said: "It's been and remains a privilege to contribute to the preservation to such an iconic vessel which turns 100 years old in 2027.

"My colleagues and I are happy in the knowledge that our efforts will ensure the lightship can be presented to the public in as good a condition as it can be.

"We look forward to welcoming visitors from far and wide when the ship re-opens next month."

Following this, major improvement works to Humber Dock Street and Princes Dock Street will be completed, enhancing the heart of Hull's waterfront. These upgrades will mark the start of a new maritime trail, linking each of the city's maritime treasures and guiding visitors through a story that spans centuries of trade, exploration, and resilience.

In late spring, the transformation of Queen's Gardens will be revealed. This ambitious project has

reimagined one of Hull's most cherished green spaces, futureproofing it for generations to come. The new-look Queen's Gardens will be a tranquil place to relax and enjoy its planting, ponds, and wildlife, with the ability to come to life as a dynamic and exciting events space that will play host to community and cultural events.

Events and celebrations of Hull's maritime heritage will reach a peak in the summer, with the reopening of the Maritime Museum following an extensive refurbishment that puts this 'jewel in the crown' firmly in the world-class category.

With 25 new galleries and 50 per cent more maritime treasures on display, visitors will be taken on an immersive journey of Hull's seafaring heritage. Traversing previously unseen areas of the Grade II\* listed building, they will have the opportunity to explore its stunning architecture while discovering the stories of love, loss, celebration, and sacrifice that have shaped Hull's identity as a thriving maritime city.

Many of the museum's much-loved favourites will return, alongside fresh narratives and cutting-edge interactive exhibits. From the whaling industry to global trade routes, the museum


will showcase Hull's role on the world stage, telling stories that will resonate with new generations.

Adding to the excitement, the Arctic Corsair, Hull's last remaining sidewriter trawler, will move to her new permanent home in a dry dock at North End Shipyard. This relocation will create a unique maritime experience along the River Hull, allowing visitors to step aboard and explore the vessel in a setting that reflects its historic significance.

Councillor Mike Ross, Leader of Hull City Council, said: "2026 will be a defining year for Hull. These projects are not just about restoring buildings and ships; they are about celebrating our unique culture and creating places that inspire pride in our city. Hull's maritime story is one of ambition and resilience. The Hull Maritime project has given us the opportunity to ensure that story is told in a way that honours our past and captivates today's and future generations."

# Hundreds sign up for social supermarket

**Over 900 people from the local area have become members of Hull's first social supermarket, which recently opened in Bransholme.**

Community Shop sells good quality surplus food products at deeply discounted prices to eligible customers, including a range which sees fruit, vegetables and bread on offer for only 20p.

Its successful launch in December was made possible by Hull City Council agreeing to allow it to operate at North Bransholme Community Centre, which it shares with the Paul Ingle Boxing Academy.

One customer said: "It's good to know I can now get some

lovely food for a lot less than the supermarkets.

"It's a brilliant place, and I'm so glad it's opened for our community.

"I'm a single mum, and the prices are so cheap that this is going to make a massive difference to us."

Another customer added: "It's the best thing that's ever happened up North Bransholme!"

As well as the supermarket, there is a Community Kitchen, where the café serves home-cooked meals.

Members pay £1.50 for main meals, with even non-members able to benefit from a cheap, tasty meal at only £3 – with kids always eating

for free regardless of whether their parents or carers have membership.

Residents are also benefitting from a range of activities offered via its Community Hub.

Councillor Ted Dolman, Portfolio holder for communities, said: "Community Shop opening in North Bransholme is absolutely a win-win situation for everyone involved.

"As a council, it ensures we continue to work in partnership with community centres across the city, bringing people together and enhancing the visibility of offers that exist to do this.

"For Community Shop, it means they can make sure that things that might otherwise go to waste can still be sold, and at a really low price.

"For local people, it means they can get good quality food and other household products cheaply and on their doorsteps, whilst also being able to access home-cooked meals and community activities.

"I'm really pleased that so many people have been able to sign up for memberships, and it's also great that Community Shop has created 12 jobs all for people from the local area."

# Revolutionising bus travel in Hull

**Ongoing investment in Hull's buses is helping to 'revolutionise the city's public transport network'**

Working together, the council, Stagecoach East Midlands and East Yorkshire Buses are improving service punctuality and introducing new electric buses and routes to make bus travel more attractive. Part of the city's bus service improvement plan, these include the launch of the 7C, a dedicated service from Hull Paragon Interchange to

Clough Road and Sutton Fields, which provides an alternative for commuters and shoppers.

Councillor Mark Ieronimo, portfolio holder for transport and infrastructure, said: "Accessing good bus services is essential and that's why we are continuing to work with the operators to ensure our residents get the services they expect.

"We've made progress over the past year, but we know there is more to do – especially around reliability and the creation of new

routes, such as the 7C."

Both operators are nearing completion of their electric vehicle infrastructure programmes to support the rollout of electric buses in the city, made possible thanks to funding from the council as part of the authority's commitment to tackling the climate emergency and creating a greener city.

The new electric buses follow successful bids to the Government by the council, in partnership with both operators and East Riding of Yorkshire Council, securing almost £10million for the purchase of 82 vehicles.

"Working collaboratively with our partners, we are seeing the revolution of Hull's public transport network," added Councillor Ieronimo.

"Electric buses are cleaner and will have a transformative impact throughout the city, changing how people see buses and helping to increase passenger demand."

The council has also improved accessibility and facilities at 100

bus stops with new high kerbs, tactile paving, seating and safety barriers, as well as installing 30 new bus shelters.

Investment also continues at Hull Paragon Interchange, with the replacement of digital screens, more seating and resurfacing. New, real-time travel displays are also going up in the city centre.

Other successful initiatives included the return of the

Moorsbus (M1), which ran every Sunday and Bank Holiday, from May to September, last year, with 2,249 passengers boarding the service and enjoying trips to the North York Moors.

The two councils also extended the Young Persons Freedom Pass, a scheme providing nearly 200 care leavers with free bus travel in Hull and the East Riding.

# Simpler Recycling - here's what you need to know

**Recycling is about to get easier! Starting March 2026, we are introducing weekly food and garden waste collections as part of the new nationwide Simpler Recycling system.**

The new Simpler Recycling system, a government policy, being delivered by the council, means everyone, whether at home, work, or school, will be able to recycle the same materials across England.

## Key changes include:

- weekly food waste collections via existing brown bins and caddies for all households, including flats
- a core set of dry recyclables collected from all households, including flats and businesses (those with blue bins will continue to receive the same service as before, and new dry recycling facilities will be introduced for flats)
- businesses and public buildings to separate food waste and recyclables from general waste.

## What have we done to prepare?

Over the past year, we've been working hard to prepare for the transition to this new system. 70 new team members have joined our waste management service to ensure the rollout runs smoothly. We also carried out a six-month trial in flats to find the most effective way to collect recycling and food waste from communal



areas. The trial tested different bin types, explored ways to reduce contamination, and looked at how to keep shared spaces clean and tidy. Residents were surveyed throughout the trial, which is helping to shape the final service – thank you!

We have also started delivering food waste caddies to residents across the city. If you don't have a brown bin, you'll receive both an indoor kitchen caddy and an outdoor caddy.

To make things even easier, we've expanded the number of free caddy liner collection points across the city, so you can pick up replacements whenever you need them: [www.hull.gov.uk/caddyliners](http://www.hull.gov.uk/caddyliners)

## What can you expect?

From March, you can expect weekly food and garden waste collections using brown bins or outdoor caddies. Homes and flats without a brown bin will receive a five-litre food caddy, and you'll get a new waste pack with your collection dates for March 2026 to March 2027.



We're also launching a new web app soon, which will send reminders for your collection day straight to your phone.

## What do you need to do?

To make the most of the new service, please put your brown bin or outdoor caddy every week out by 7am on your collection day – please check your bin collection calendar if you're unsure of dates: [www.hull.gov.uk/binchecker](http://www.hull.gov.uk/binchecker)

Remember to use our caddy liners in your indoor caddy. If you're worried about smells or liners splitting, we recommend that you empty your caddy regularly, double bag with two liners, and tie them securely before placing them in your brown bin.

Councillor Charles Quinn, portfolio holder for environment at Hull City Council said: "This is an exciting change for Hull. The new system will make recycling simpler

and more consistent for everyone, while helping us cut down on waste going to incineration - protecting our environment for future generations."

# Caring for someone else's child? A little awareness could make a big difference

**Private fostering is where a child under 16 years old (or under 18 years if they have a disability) is being cared for and is living with someone who isn't their parent or a close relative for more than 28 days. These arrangements are often made informally between families and carers.**

It's estimated that thousands of children across the UK live in private fostering situations.

## These can include:

- Teenagers staying with friends due to family difficulties
- Children living with a friend's parent while their own parents work or study abroad
- International students staying with host families during school holidays.

Many private fostering arrangements go unreported, leaving children and the adults involved, without essential welfare

checks. Just like other councils Hull City Council has a legal duty to ensure these children are safe and well cared for, but this can only happen if the Early Help and Safeguarding Hub (EHASH) knows about any such arrangements. Trusted adults in a family's life can play a vital role in identifying private fostering arrangements, including schools or health providers. Councillor Linda Tock, the portfolio holder for Children's Services, said: "Private fostering arrangements are often made with the very best intentions, but when they go unreported, children can miss out on the support and safeguarding they are entitled to. By raising awareness and encouraging people to let us know when a child is living away from their parents, we can make sure children are safe, supported and able to thrive. Even a simple conversation or notification can make a real difference to a child's life."



Laura Pickering, Designated Nurse Safeguarding Children and Young People, NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) said: "Health professionals can play a vital role in identifying when children might be living in private fostering arrangements, and it is important they are aware of their role in relation to sharing information and notification to the relevant local authority if they become aware a child is being privately fostered. This helps ensure children, young people and families get the support they need and children are safeguarded appropriately." **Benefits to children when arrangements are reported:**

- 1) When private fostering arrangements are reported, children are less likely to feel invisible and more likely to feel safe and understood. Schools can respond more effectively to emotional, behavioural, or learning needs by having a clear picture of the child's living situation. This shared awareness helps provide consistency, reassurance, and stability at a time when children may be experiencing significant change
- 2) Children feel more secure when trusted adults know their situation and work together.
- 3) It helps schools support emotional needs and provide stability during changes at home. If you are a parent or carer and you think you may be involved or have some kind of Private Fostering arrangement we'd like to hear from you, extra help, support and advice might be available to you.

## You should ideally:

- Notify the Early Help and Safeguarding Hub (EHASH) at least six weeks before the child moves in (or as soon as possible if you think you have such an arrangement already in place).
  - Contact EHASH to get advice about your situation. Registering Private Fostering arrangements ensures:
  - Children receive proper health care and education
  - Carers importantly get guidance and support
  - Homes are safe and suitable
- If you know of a Private Fostering arrangement or think a child might be living in one, contact 01482 448 879 or email [EHASH@hullcc.gov.uk](mailto:EHASH@hullcc.gov.uk). Together, we can make sure every child in our community has a safe, caring home. # Freetown Way scheme to start this month


**A major transport scheme to return Freetown Way to two lanes of traffic, in both directions, and develop new, safe off-road cycle infrastructure to encourage active travel will get underway this month.**

The council is working with Balfour Beatty to deliver the multi-million-pound investment, which has been carefully planned and phased to minimise disruption on the city centre's highway network, especially as other ongoing schemes are finished, such as the A63 improvements by Highways

England and the council's essential repair and strengthening works on Drypool Bridge.

"We said that we would listen to what our residents wanted when it comes to traffic and travel in the city. They wanted Freetown Way back to two lanes and they wanted more off-road cycling options. This scheme delivers on both," said Councillor Mark Ieronimo, cabinet portfolio holder for transport and infrastructure.

"What we have developed has taken into consideration a full range of views and has been designed to help people travel

across the city by whatever mode of transport they choose.

"We'd like to thank our residents, businesses and communities for providing feedback and helping us shape this scheme.

"We are confident this scheme will work for everyone, whether you travel by bike, by car or on foot, and we are keen now to get on with the job."

The scheme represents a significant investment in one of Hull's busiest routes.

It will see the footways on both sides of Freetown Way widened, between Witham and Blundell's Corner, to accommodate safe, off-road cycle tracks, providing

separated areas for both people cycling and pedestrians.

The scheme, which is part-funded by an allocation from Active Travel England's Active Travel Fund (ATF), will also see cycle-optimised protected signals (CYCLOPS) junctions installed at Blundell's Corner and Witham, as well as Freetown Way's junctions with Wright Street, Charles Street, Caroline Street / Worship Street and George Street.

**In addition, the scheme will also include:**

- the separation of left turning traffic from people cycling straight ahead at junctions to improve safety
- additional pedestrian crossings
- early start signals to support the safety of people cycling
- improved facilities for pedestrians and people cycling at junctions
- removal of cycle lanes, along the road, across North Bridge and replacement with off-road cycle track
- removal of on-road cycle lanes at Blundell's Corner
- new off-road cycle tracks around the Blundell's Corner junction, fully separated from traffic and pedestrians.

# Roundabout improvement works to start in Kingswood

**Improvements to two roundabouts in Kingswood will get underway from March to help ease congestion and enhance journey times.**

CR Reynolds Ltd, a Hessle-based construction company, has been appointed by the council to deliver schemes at the Ennerdale Leisure Centre and Wawne Road / Bude Road roundabouts.

These works will:

- increase capacity on the highway network
- improve cycle and pedestrian facilities to support people to walk, wheel and cycle
- provide new signalised cycle and pedestrian crossing points to improve safety
- see the management of trees in the area. Where it can be accommodated, some trees

will be taken up and replanted. Where this is not possible, twice as many replacement trees will be planted to improve the local landscape.

The works include:

- ✓ junction widening
- ✓ surface water drainage and storage improvement
- ✓ cycleway provision
- ✓ soft landscaping
- ✓ tree transplanting
- ✓ street lighting
- ✓ utility diversions
- ✓ new pedestrian signalised crossings.


The improvements are necessary following several new housing developments in the area over the past few years and will ensure the network is fit for the future, providing safer commuter and leisure routes and offering a

huge boost to cyclists, pedestrians and runners alike.

Councillor Mark Ieronimo, cabinet portfolio holder for transport and infrastructure, said: "These works represent a major investment in our city's future, tackling congestion and ensuring our roads can cope with growth while making them safer and more accessible for everyone."

The council and its contractor will take a phased approach to minimise disruption and will work on both sites simultaneously to shorten the overall length of construction, with the aim of being completed by the end of the year.

## Science, Culture, & Community Collide in Hull this March





On Friday 13 March, the Cultural Tides conference brings together international speakers to explore cultural trends shaping our world, and how heritage, technology, and global partnerships can shape the city's next chapter. This thought-provoking event adds a global dimension to Hull's weekend of celebration.

### Our City: A Carnival of Hull's Unique Spirit

On Saturday 14 March, Hull will celebrate its identity with Our City, a spectacular new event led by local arts charity Back to Ours. Two dazzling processions – one by day and one by night – will fill the streets with colour, music, and magic. Featuring four stunning show globes, the parades will wind through the city centre before culminating in a breathtaking finale at Queen Victoria Square.

Expect music, dancing and wonder in a celebration that unites communities and pays tribute to Hull's unique character.





**YOUR POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER**  
**JONATHAN EVISON**

**I'm pleased to bring you the latest update from my office on the work we are doing to improve community safety in Hull.**

I would like to thank residents who have taken the time to complete the Annual Police and Crime Plan survey last year. Hearing your voice is important to our work and these findings will help us shape future policing in your area. My team has been analysing your feedback, and we will share the full survey results in the near future.

In Hull, your top 5 priorities were found to be Burglary, Drug-related crime, Dangerous Driving, Nuisance ASB and Knife or weapon enabled crime. The survey results also suggested an increase in confidence in Humberside Police in 2025 compared with 2024.

This year our survey will be running during July to September. To participate in this, or to learn about other work completed by my office please follow us on social media and subscribe to My Community Alert to be notified of the work we are doing in your area and get involved in making a difference.

**COMMUNITY SAFETY FUND**

After a successful Round 6 of my Community Safety Fund, a number of projects were approved and are delivering in your area. These include:

**East Hull Falcons:** Purchase of secure storage for football equipment - £1,500

**Hull Turkish Education Society:** Installation of CCTV cameras - £ 5,850

**St John Newland:** Installation of CCTV cameras - £1,350

I am looking to launch the next Round in the spring, so please keep an eye on our website and social media channels for announcements when we go live.

**#JUSTDONT CAMPAIGN LAUNCHES ACROSS THE HUMBER REGION**



Launched in **December 2025**, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Humberside has introduced **#JustDont**, a region wide campaign encouraging young men to challenge harassment and harmful behaviours towards women and girls. Developed with input from local young men and grounded in bystander theory, the campaign provides simple, safe ways to speak up — even when the behaviour comes from a friend.

Police and Crime Commissioner **Jonathan Evison** says the aim is to build a culture where “courage means standing up for women and girls, and respect is the norm.”

With many young women reporting experiences of harassment in public spaces, #JustDont calls on men and boys to play an active role in creating safer streets, safer nights out and safer communities. Schools, venues, youth groups and businesses across the Humber are supporting the campaign and helping to share its message.

**POL-ED LAUNCHES IN THE HUMBER REGION**



The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner has purchased access to the “**Pol-Ed**” programme to help develop young people’s awareness of risks, citizenship and the law.

Created by West Yorkshire Police and subject matter experts, Pol-Ed is an educational programme that is now available to all schools in the Humberside Police Force region, free of charge.

Covering early years through to Key Stage 5 (post-16), the ready-to-go resources include lesson plans, activities for pupils and special event packs for themed weeks and awareness dates. The topic areas span relationships, keeping safe, understanding the law and wellbeing.

Alongside resources for teachers, there is a range of materials for police forces and the four local authorities to deliver in schools or other educational settings. Further resources known as “Youth Inputs” will soon be available for use by community and care groups.

There is also an option for sessions to be delivered with support from Humberside Police’s Safer Schools Officers.
